

## California Compliance Issues

California law classifies assault weapons under several categories. The classification relevant to the CA version semi-auto M249 is “features” based. This classification looks to what “features” a firearm is configured with to determine if it is deemed an assault rifle.

In simplest terms, to NOT be deemed an assault rifle, the overall length of the firearm must be greater than 30 inches and NOT possess any restricted “features”.

The CA semi-auto M249 is configured with a length over 30 inches (approximately 41 inches), has NO flash hider (CA compliant muzzle break has been substituted), has NO forward pistol grip, has NO rear pistol grip (since it is covered by the Kydex cover from Solar Tactical), and has a fixed stock. This configuration is what is commonly called a “featureless” built rifle.
